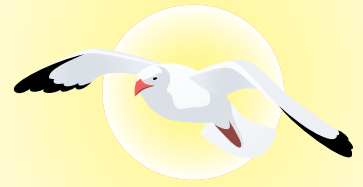

FIRST FRIDAY COFFEE & CONVERSATION

First Friday Coffee and Conversation will no longer take place the first Friday of each month. It has been a platform for residents to ask questions about their community from a hosting emcee. Even though we will no longer be hosting FFC&C it is suggested for residents that have a particular question to seek out that correlating committee meeting (published in the newsletter and on the Huntington Landmark website) for answers. For example, if you have a question regarding a parking issue, please attend a Property Protection meeting. They meet the third Wednesday of the month in the Sewing Room at 1:00 PM. If you have a question about the plants around your home, please attend a Landscape meeting and so on. Going directly to the committee will most likely get your questions answered and keep you informed on issues you are most interested in.

December's First Friday Coffee & Conversation (FFC&C) offered another valuable opportunity to ask questions, and share concerns. We appreciate the opportunity to get quick responses to our questions from the Board members and management staff in attendance. This newsletter article will only hit key points; we encourage all residents to join us each month at FFC&C to hear the full discussion. As the meeting name indicates these sessions are held on the first Friday of the month; 10:00 AM is our start time; location is the main Lounge.

Residents were reminded to pick up a copy of the new fine schedule in the Management Office. The time to submit comments was extended beyond the usual 30-day period, in light of the very busy holiday season. A suggestion was made to include items like this as an insert in the monthly newsletter to assure that residents and off-site owners are aware of changes.

A question was asked about the Main Lounge being unlocked on Christmas and New Year's, in light of the doors being locked on Thanksgiving. Attendees were assured that the room will be open.

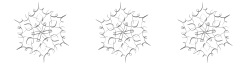
Several residents shared concerns about parking. One resident reported being cited for not placing her car in the garage, in error. Some attendees offered examples of rare occasions when they might not garage their car at night; one example was arriving home late and not wanting to walk from a poorly lit garage area. One person noted that if a medical condition or hospitalization causes a car to be parked outside the garage, this information should be shared with the office. Comments called for enforcement of the rules consistently and uniformly, while allowing for some flexibility.

Questions were asked about a specific Board agenda item from the December 3 Board meeting. Board President Bob Crossley advised that the agenda item

concerning limiting attendance at classes and clubs to Landmark residents was tabled. Additional discussion centered around the cost of set-up and tear-down for the bridge group.

A resident who is a renter protested the recent advisement that only owner can submit work orders. She noted that she has advised the office of problems in the common area via a work order, for the good of the community. Also, her completion of a work order regarding an issue in her unit saves time and assures the issue is addressed promptly.

One long-term resident (18 years) noted that the friendly atmosphere she enjoyed here at Landmark seems to have vanished. She couldn't identify the reason behind this change, but called upon everyone to work to regain this feeling of community and friendship. We hope to continue this conversation at our January FFC&C; all are invited to join the conversation on January 8, 1016.

LANDMARK LANDSCAPE REPORT

Happy New Year from the Landscape Committee!

A Review of Private Landscaping:

As each Phase in Landmark is renovated, building maintenance may cause landscaping to be damaged -or even removed altogether. However, once all renovation is completed landscapers will replace Association plants and repair damaged areas. If you wish to plant your own private plants, a "Request for Landscape Change" (copies found in the Management office) must be completed and approved by the Landscape Committee (LC) before planting may be done.

Once approval has been granted, or if your unit has had landscaping which was previously approved, please review the following guidelines for Private Landscaping before you consider a landscape change:

Nothing may be re-planted nor potted plants replaced around your condominium or garage building without approval of the Landscape Committee (LC); see 2010 Rules and Regulations Addendum C. Applications and a list of approved plants are available from the Management Office. Due to current drought conditions, the LC may not consider new planting changes.

Re-plantings must provide for the following:

- Ample access for maintaining, painting, and fumigating buildings.
- Reduce moisture-caused damage (rot, mold and mildew) to buildings.
- Protect roofs, gutters, and downspouts from damage by trees, leaves and needles.
- Discourage subterranean termites, wildlife, and pests near buildings.
- Ample access to utility controls, meters and vaults; especially in emergencies.
- Insure the safety of maintenance personnel and pedestrians.

Private planting and potted plants must adhere to the following standards:

- Specific types of plantings (vines, ferns, etc.) that are known to cause problems will not be approved as they are known to

damage buildings. A list of approved plants is available from the Management Office.

- Private plantings and potted plants must be kept at least 24" away from buildings.
- Ground cover, wood chips, mulch, bricks and rocks must be kept at least 12" away from buildings in order to prevent dampness around and damage to buildings.
- Brackets, wires, etc. used to support plants must not be attached to buildings.
- Plantings and potted plants near sewer cleanouts and utility controls, meters and vaults will not be approved.
- Unobstructed access by maintenance and emergency personnel must be provided to:
 - * gas, water, and electrical shutoffs and meters, utility vaults, and irrigation controls
 - * downspouts, splash blocks, sewer cleanouts, hose bibbs, and backflow preventers
 - * telephone, television, FIOS, and satellite cables and boxes
- Soil near buildings must be graded so water drains away from and does not stand near buildings.
- A 3-6" clearance must be maintained between the soil and the bottom of building wood and stucco and/or the top of building foundation.

DISASTER PREPAREDNESS COMMITTEE

El Nino is on the way. Flooding is a possibility for those who live on the first floor of a building. Sandbags are available now at the Edison Community Center, which is next to the fire house on Magnolia and Hamilton. Bring your ID and a shovel. CERT members will deliver sandbags to the disabled or elderly. It is a volunteer service, so call 714-536-5974 to set up a delivery time. *You are responsible for getting rid of the sandbags after use.*

If the water is rising, secure your home. Move outdoor furniture inside, if possible. To keep the damage down, move light-weight items on top of other furniture. For instance, put chairs on top of tables or counters. Disconnect electrical appliances. Remember to never touch electrical equipment if you are wet or standing in water. Move important documents up from the bottom drawers of desks and cabinets so they won't get wet. Don't forget the garage — move cardboard boxes and other easily damaged items off the floor of the garage.

Now is the time to think of ways to protect our property if flooding happens. Your basic home owners insurance policy does NOT cover flood loses, so you may want to call your insurance agent about getting flood insurance.

Call Karen Clausen at 714-846-0472 and volunteer to be a Building Steward for your building. It would be great if we could get 100% coverage!

Our next meeting will be January 18 at 2:30 PM in MPR1. Paul Kanter will review emergency evacuation procedures for Landmark. Something we all need to know.

I acted as the liaison with landscape contractors to include irrigation, landscaping, common area trees, and the supervision of the landscape contractor, including being the liaison for the Forest Committee and maintaining 7000 Eucalyptus trees in the forest.

I oversaw and supervised a maintenance crew of 7-8 employees and made the necessary repairs to the pools, spa, lagoon, lakes, weirs, duck pond, aerators, pumps, and clubhouse and common areas such as walls, fencing, street repairs, and sidewalks.

Prior to coming to Landmark I su-

pervised the Community Relations Manager and managed a department of 6-8 Community Services Representatives responsible for enforcement of the CC&R's and the rules and regulations.

I'm looking forward to providing my skills and services to Huntington Landmark and its residents and being a part of this wonderful community. Thank you.

- Potted plants on patios must be located at least 6" away from walls and fences and hand-watered in order to prevent dampness which may damage buildings. Use of hoses for watering plants in patios is not allowed.

Most Association plants are in good condition, have been in our landscape for many years and have become drought-tolerant. Because the LC desires to maintain an overall attractive appearance of our landscaping, a request

to install new bushes and plants will require careful consideration by the Committee. Many so-called "drought tolerant" plants require changes in irrigation and do not survive more than a short time in our soil. Your cooperation is appreciated as we work together to keep our community beautiful.

COOKING WITH CATHY



I have a cookie recipe. I make pretty good chocolate chip cookies. I follow the recipe on the back of the chocolate chip bag ... just like everyone else does. So, I decided to make Oatmeal Raisin. Woohoo! Big daring step.

And then I started changing it up. I substituted Rye flour for boring bleached wheat. I used real butter. I added dried cherries in place of raisins. Finally, my favorite, not just cinnamon, I put in Pumpkin Pie Spice.

They turned out great! I'm not bragging, well maybe a little. I love the difference the Rye flour makes in the flavor. I really enjoy the tangyness of the cherries as opposed to sweet raisins. I gave some to my Chocolate chip (no surprise) cookie loving husband. He asks for them to give to people for gifts. I took some to work and my boss said they were her new favorite cookie. Everyone I share them with asks for the recipe.

Is that enough build up? I could go on but that would be annoying.

Cathy's Oatmeal Cherry Cookies

In a large bowl, cream together

- 1 ½ cups Butter
- ¾ cup Brown Sugar
- ½ cup regular Sugar
- Add 1 Egg
- 1 tsp Vanilla

In a small bowl, blend

- 1 ½ cups Rye Flour
- 1 tsp Baking Soda
- 1 tsp Salt
- 1 ¼ tsp Pumpkin Pie Spice

Gradually stir the dry ingredients into the wet. Finally, stir in

- 3 cups of Oats
- 1 cup Dried Cherries

Cover and chill while the oven preheats to 375°. Bake cookies until they smell good ... and are lightly browned ... about 10 minutes. Makes 3-4 dozen cookies.

I have added different ingredients just for fun. I couldn't find cherries while in Texas, but my mom had a small bag of dried blueberries and some orange flavored cranberries. Lately I have been adding things like ½ cup of chopped

pecans or a handful of flax seeds.

When available, we loan wheelchairs, canes, walkers, companion chairs, crouches, shower chairs and commodes to residents in need.

The phone 714-960-2277, is answered daily by volunteers and we ask that you give us 24 hours notice of needing an item. When calling, speak slowly and distinctly, leaving us your name, your unit number, phone and what item you are looking to borrow.

Someone will get back to you as soon as possible as to item availability and to make pick-up/delivery arrangements.

When returning these items, please make sure that your name and unit number are noted so that the paperwork can be completed for the return. And DO NOT just leave them in the recreation area – return them to a member of the committee or recreation personnel.

We also accept donations of these items. Please call the 714-960-2277 and leave a message if you have something you wish to donate.
